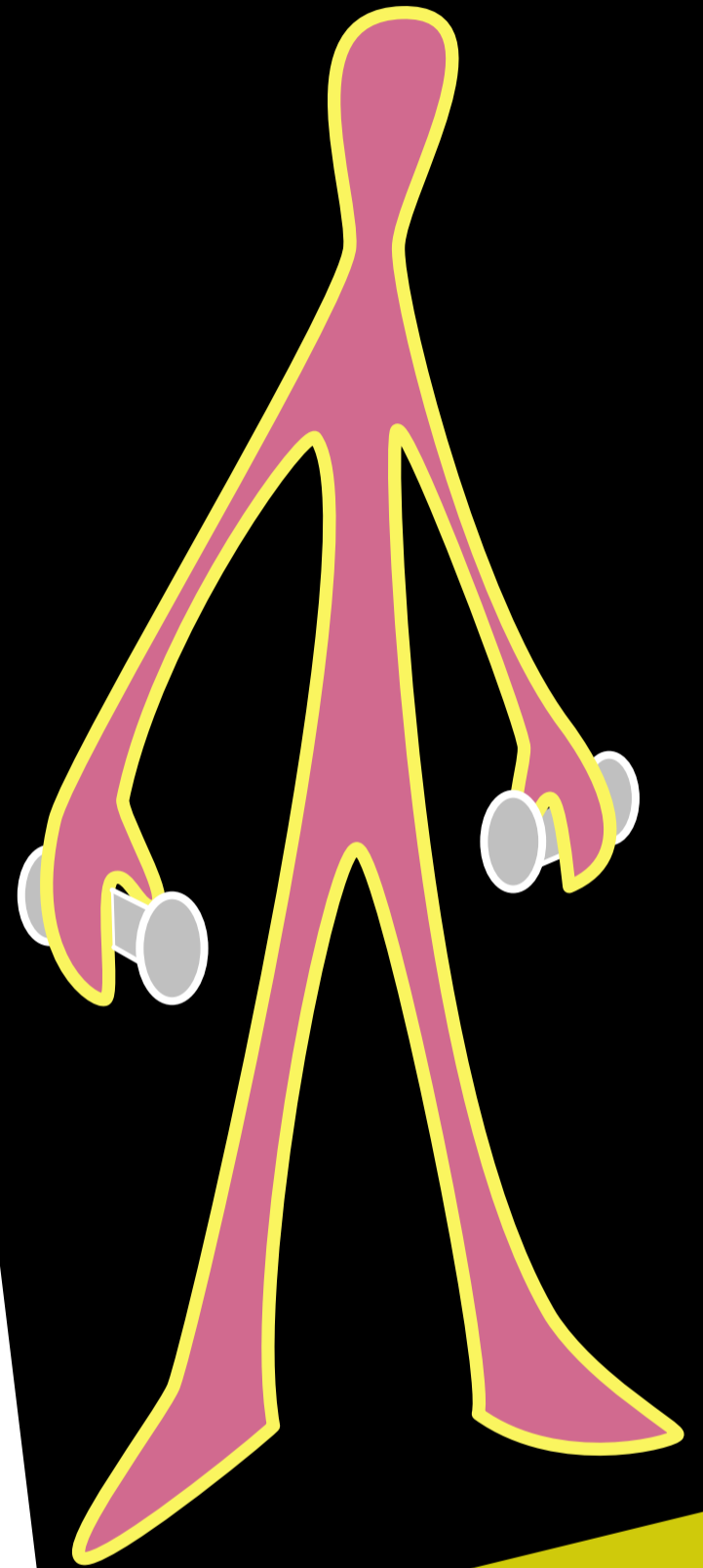

MATHS


## I want to be paid!
